

## Christ is Risen, ALLELUIA!

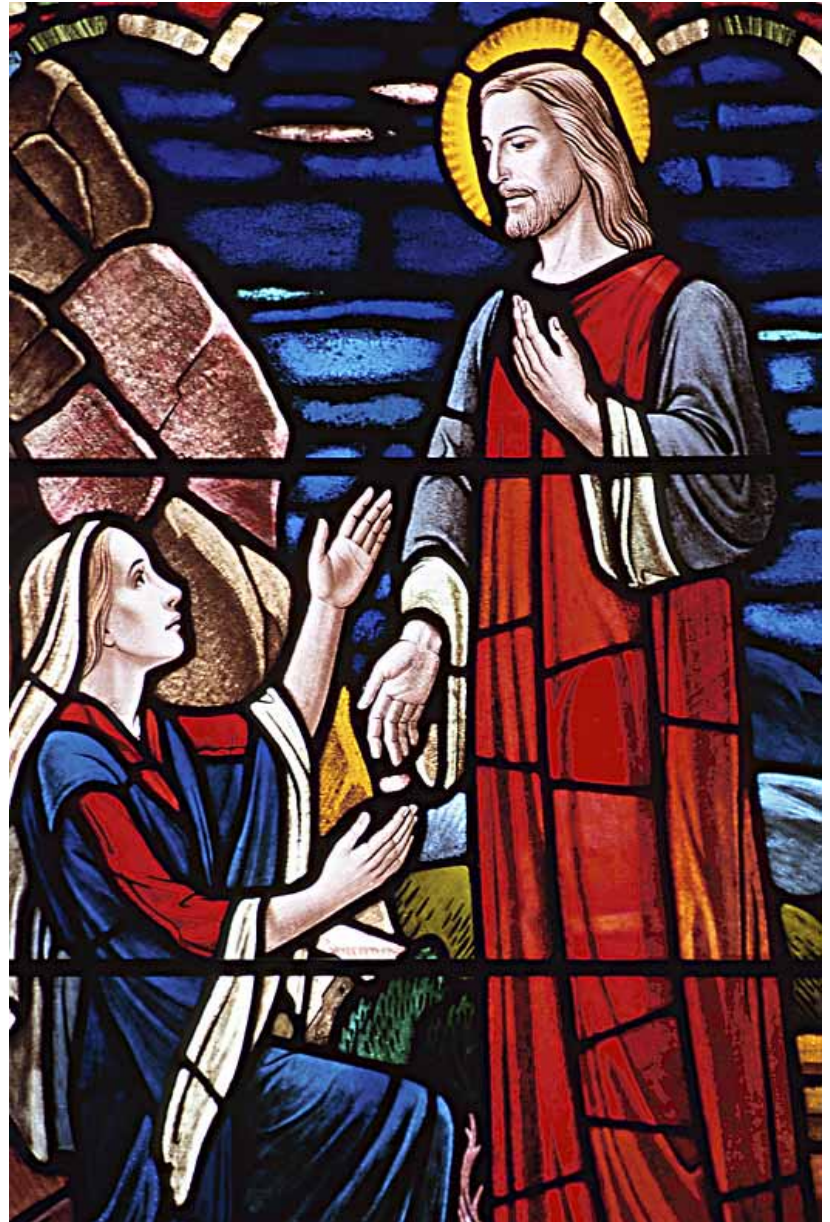

*"Christ is risen, Alleluia! He is risen indeed, Alleluia, Alleluia!"* With this joyful proclamation, Christians have greeted each other for two thousand years.

For centuries, the proclamation of this miraculous moment has invigorated Christians all over the world. On Good Friday, after crucifixion and death, the body of Jesus was laid in the tomb and a stone rolled across the entrance. To be sure that his body would not be taken, Pilate had soldiers guard the tomb and the watch began. For three days, Jesus' followers waited and wondered what would happen. And for three days the soldiers watched the door of that tomb. Our Lord's enemies did what they could to prevent his resurrection.

There is no tomb in the world that can keep the Son of God imprisoned. His persecutors thought they had overcome Jesus and his mission. They thought they had won and finally put Jesus to death. But death had not overcome Jesus so much as Jesus would overcome death. As we celebrate the feast of Easter let us leave behind our old way of darkness and sin and put on the new life Christ has won for us through his victory over the grave. Let us live boldly in Christ's light proclaiming the good news of Jesus' resurrection. Again this Easter, we announce to the world the victory of our Lord and the life that is ours through his resurrection: *"Christ is risen, Alleluia! He is risen indeed, Alleluia, Alleluia!"*

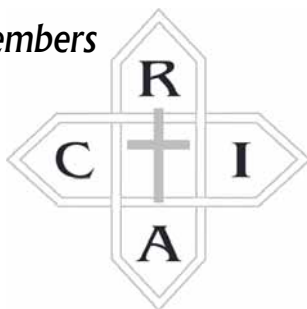
(The 10:00 AM Easter Sunday Mass is broadcast on Relevant Radio, 1330 on the AM dial, at 8:00 PM.

No ground level parking; violators will be towed! The Energy Center Ramp may be accessed from either 3rd Avenue (northbound) or 4th Avenue (southbound).

### DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

We prefer the world of fantasy to the world of reality, which is why Easter, unlike Christmas, never made it big as a secular holiday. Here we have an adult Jesus who is a more threatening figure than a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger. And his message speaks to activity that is disturbing, challenging, and unnerving. Add to that the cross with its suffering and the tomb and the idea of leaving the tomb. It's all a bit much for a society that prefers making eggnog to making sacrifices, receiving presents to receiving challenges, singing carols to carrying a cross. Unlike Christmas, Easter can be offensive and frightening and all too revealing of our deficiencies in following Jesus.

1. What would you say are the most disturbing aspects of the cross and resurrection of Jesus?

2. What could be other reasons for Easter's lukewarm popularity?

3. Are there Easter traditions you hold dear? How do they speak to the message of Easter?

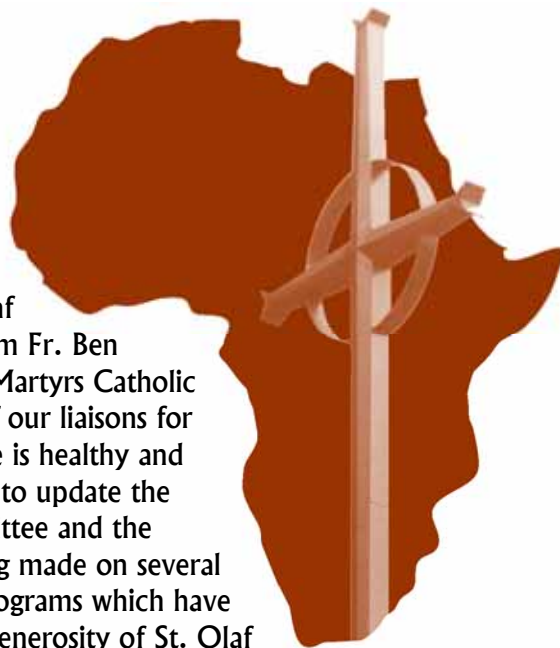
## The African Partnership at St. Olaf

This past December St. Olaf was favored with a visit from Fr. Ben Oleket, pastor of Uganda Martyrs Catholic Church in Busia and one of our liaisons for the African Partnership. He is healthy and doing well. He was excited to update the African Partnership Committee and the parish on the progress being made on several building and scholarship programs which have been set up thanks to the generosity of St. Olaf parishioners. Major headway is being made on setting up a health clinic in Kakurikit and planning is underway for more reliable supplies of water and electricity for the villages of Busia, Bulanda, Mwari, Kakurikit and Ojamii.

Most gratifying to me personally was to hear Fr. Ben's stories of the profoundly positive impact our scholarship program is having with students in the villages through your donations to the African Partnership. St. Olaf parishioners have been helping many students continue their education, where lack of this financial support would have made further education of these students virtually impossible. Fr. Ben offered Masses of Thanksgiving while he was here and asked that we continue to extend his deep thanks and gratitude to the parishioners of St. Olaf for their continued support.

May 15-16, St. Olaf will have its annual African Partnership Appeal. There will be information and festivities after all Masses in the Gathering Room about this important partnership with our friends in Kenya. Thank you and God bless you!
